WHAT IS KAMP TUMAINI?

- Kamp Tumaini ('hope' in Swahili) is a 2 week camp in Kenya, through CBM's *Guardians of Hope* program.
- Canadian & Kenyan Christian youth volunteer together to give children impacted by HIV and AIDS a camp experience filled with hope.
- Consists of activities that include time for play, learning crafts and skills, connecting with each other, and Bible studies.

WHAT IS GUARDIANS OF HOPE?

- CBM's *Guardians of Hope* program aims at HIV and AIDS prevention & support for those who are infected and their families.
- The program helps overcome stigma through education, assists with community development projects, and provides resources to help communities respond to needs of orphans.
- It has been operating in Kenya for over 10 years, to bring dignity, hope and transformation in the name of Jesus.

WHY KAMP TUMAINI?

- Kenya is the country with the 4th largest number of HIV and AIDS infections in the world.
- Approximately 1.4 million Kenyans currently live with HIV. Around 160,000 of these are children.
- Children in families affected by HIV and AIDS experience stigma, isolation, fear, grief and loneliness. Many have lost parents and other loved ones to AIDS, and some are HIV positive themselves.

WHO IS INVITED TO KAMP TUMAINI?

- Kenyan children between the ages of 9 - 16, who are part of *Guardians of Hope*.

WHAT CAN I DO?

- Pray for the children, their families, Kamp organisers and counsellors.

2018 SERVE KAMP TUMAINI TRIP

WHO CAN APPLY?

- Anyone 16 years of age or older.
- Must have attended SERVE at least once between 2014 - 2016.
- Must be committed followers of Jesus who are connected and involved in a local church.
- Must be willing to attend all team meetings (approximately one per month).

WHAT WILL I BE DOING AS A CAMP COUNSELLOR?

- Sharing & showing Christ's love to campers through word and deed.
- Responsible for campers generally and specifically for the ones placed in your care.
- All team members will be expected to be a team player with both Canadian and Kenyan teammates, welcome campers enthusiastically, and participate fully in the preparation and leading of the program and all activities.

HOW BIG IS THE TEAM? WHO ARE THE LEADERS?

- The SERVE Kamp Tumaini team will be made up of 10 students from across Western Canada, and 2 leaders.

HOW MUCH DOES THE TRIP COST?

- Approximately \$3800 CAD. Actual cost will be confirmed once flights are purchased.
- Includes all flights, insurance, accommodations, meals, in-country travel and project costs.
- Does not include the cost of a Kenya visa or required vaccinations.

HOW CAN I RAISE THAT MUCH MONEY?

- Individuals & churches are able to make donations towards your trip costs. Any donation \$10+ will receive a tax receipt.

WHAT ABOUT VACCINATIONS?

- CBM does not give medical advice, but we recommend that each team member visit a travel clinic & follow their advice.

IS KENYA SAFE?

- Kenya, like any other country, is not 100% safe. However, the team will be accompanied by CBM Field Staff who live in Nairobi and precautions will be taken for your security and well-being.
